



# **Adult Safeguarding Policy**



This policy applies to all members, volunteers or anyone working on behalf of City of Birmingham Brass Band.

### The purpose of this policy:

The purpose of this policy is to demonstrate the commitment of City of Birmingham Brass Band.to safeguarding adults (over 18s) and to ensure that everyone involved in it is aware of:

- The legislation, policy and procedures for safeguarding adults.
- Their role and responsibility for safeguarding adults.
- What to do or who to speak to if they have a concern relating to the welfare or wellbeing of an adult within the organisation.

### Legal framework

Safeguarding Adults in all home nations is compliant with United Nations directives on the rights of disabled people and commitments to the rights of older people. It is covered by:

- The Human Rights Act 1998
- The Data Protection Act 2018
- General Data Protection Regulations 2018

The practices and procedures within this policy are based on the relevant legislation and government guidance.

# **Adult Safeguarding Policy**



- Any concern that an adult is not safe is taken seriously, responded to promptly, and followed up in line
  with City of Birmingham Brass Band's Safeguarding Adults Policy and Procedures.
- The well-being of those at risk of harm will be put first and the adult actively supported to communicate their views and the outcomes they want to achieve. Where necessary advice on individual cases will be sought from the Ann Craft Trust.
- Any actions taken will respect the rights and dignity of all those involved and be proportionate to the risk of harm.
- City of Birmingham Brass Band acts in accordance with best practice advice, for example, from BBE, Ann Craft Trust.
- City of Birmingham Brass Band will cooperate with the Police and the relevant Local Authorities in taking action to safeguard an adult.
- All members and volunteers understand their role and responsibility for safeguarding adults
- shares information about anyone found to be a risk to adults with the appropriate bodies. For example: Disclosure and Barring Service, Services, Police, Local Authority/Social Services.
